Dear Leah Dyck:

This is further to your request submitted under the *Access to Information Act*, received at Employment and Social Development Canada on March 27, 2024, and which reads as follows:

***“Amendment to text confirmed on April 30, 2024:***

***The number of people in the electoral riding of Barrie and Innisfil, Ontario, who received a combined total of \$2,000 or less for all benefits they receive (OAS+GIS), as well as (CPP) in December 2020, December 2021, December 2022 and December 2023.***

***Original text:***

***The number of people who reside in Barrie and Innisfil, Ontario who received either an OAS, GIS, CPP Disability, or a CPP Payment of \$2000 or less, in December 2020, December 2021, December 2022 and December 2023. Could I also have the numbers in Barrie and Innisfil listed (Separately (not combined)? Could I also have the numbers for OAS, GIS, CPP and CPP Disability listed separated as well?”***

While every effort is being made to process your request as quickly as possible, an extension of up to 15 days is required beyond the 30-day statutory limit, as permitted by paragraph 9(1)(a) of the Act which states:

*“9(1) The head of a government institution may extend the time limit set out in section 7 or subsection 8(1) in respect of a request under this Act for a reasonable period of time, having regard to the circumstances, if*

*(a) the request is for a large number of records or necessitates a*

*search through a large number of records and meeting the original time limit would unreasonably interfere with the operations of the government institution.”*

However, please be assured that if your request is processed earlier than expected, the records will be provided to you prior to this extended deadline.

You are entitled to complain to the Information Commissioner concerning the processing of your request within 60 days of the receipt of this notice. In the event you decide to avail yourself of this right, your notice of complaint should be addressed to: Office of the Information Commissioner of Canada, 30 Victoria Street, 7<sup>th</sup> Floor, Gatineau, QC K1A 1H3.
