Executive Summary

As requested, here is a detailed statement of activities for Fresh Food Weekly (FFW), the criteria used to determine who is eligible for our free food delivery service, as well as a description of all the partnerships in which Fresh Food Weekly has entered into. I have not created a new governing document for Fresh Food Weekly yet as I am still hoping it can be an internal division of The VanDyck Foundation.

I also wanted to let you know that when I first started Fresh Food Weekly, I had different ideas for it (i.e. buying food in bulk at Costco), but things have changed since then (when I originally submitted my application in May 2021). Local farmers started donating their extra produce and the very first delivery day was June 4, 2021. I got 100 pounds of parsnips from Cookstown Greens in Thornton, Ont. I divided up the parsnips into 50 paper bags and left them at the doorsteps of 50 units at 380 Duckworth Street; a Barrie Municipal Non-Profit Housing Corporation (BMNPHC). And yes, this is the same address I've been living at since 2009. Each paper bag included a business card, as well as a letter explaining who I am and what I was doing.

*On an interesting side note, Cookstown Greens' produce is 100% certified organic and they actually have a contract with Maple Leaf Sports & Entertainment and so the recipients of our program received the exact same food the Toronto Maple Leafs were eating after their practices.

I asked everyone to let me know if they would like to keep receiving more free food each week - about 50% of people said thanks but no thanks and the other 50% said yes, please! I then started reaching out to local churches asking for volunteer drivers and got some more help that way. Through word-of-mouth, more and more people started signing up for the program. At this point, the website still said the program was for low-income families living in public housing. But single moms paying full market value rent kept reaching out and I could never turn them down. So now it's for anyone who says they are in need.

This weekly free food delivery pilot program ended on June 26, 2021. I tried really hard to find a new operating space to be donated but I couldn't find one. This is a <u>nine-minute interview I did on CBC</u> radio, right after the delivery program ended. It explains a little bit more about the program and then I ask listeners to reach out if they might have an empty space they can let us use so the program can keep going.

My next step after getting charitable status for Fresh Food Weekly is to apply for funding so I can lease an operating space and start running the program again.

Charitable Purposes

Purpose #1 - To relieve poverty by providing a food delivery service to people who are of limited means.

Activities in Support of Purpose #1: Pilot Program



Fresh Food Weekly (FFW) operated a free food delivery service out of a Barrie Municipal Non-Profit Housing Corporation (BMNPHC) community room located on the main level of 380 Duckworth Street., Barrie, ON, L4M6J8.



FFW was receiving donated fresh produce and bread items from 20 local farmers and food businesses - 14 of which donated on a weekly basis. FFW picked up this donated food and stored it in fridges/freezers until the next delivery day. Each week, up to 20 volunteer drivers delivered this food to the front doorsteps of the program's recipients. This "pilot program" began on June 3, 2021, and ended on Sept. 26, 2021. During this four-month period, FFW received a total of 41,724 pounds of donated fresh produce and bread items and delivered it to 267 low-income families each week. Fresh Food Weekly is currently staffed by one volunteer; Leah Dyck. Fresh Food Weekly also operates a website: www.FreshFoodWeekly.com and never advertised the program; it grew so quickly due to word-of-mouth.

The relief of poverty is a recognized charitable purpose category. To be a registered charity, organizations must show both of the following:

- Their beneficiaries are experiencing poverty.
- Their activities provide a charitable benefit that relieves the poverty of their beneficiaries.

For the Charities Directorate's purposes, people experiencing poverty are those who do not have the ability to acquire the basic necessities of life or simple amenities that are seen as necessary for a modest but adequate standard of living.

Organizations may also need to establish criteria to evaluate their beneficiaries to make sure that they need poverty relief. To establish appropriate criteria, charities may use recognized poverty indicators or they may establish their own criteria.

Generally, an organization will define its eligible beneficiaries in its charitable purpose(s). When drafting a charitable purpose, an organization should use a term that clearly describes its beneficiaries as those in need of poverty relief.


Chosen term: people who are of limited means.

Charities must have well-reasoned criteria and processes for how to choose their beneficiaries. This is why it is imperative for Fresh Food Weekly (FFW) to provide a social service that doesn't make people feel ashamed or humiliated when using it. Therefore, FFW will not request income verification from beneficiaries. FFW will allow anyone who says they're in need to sign up as long as they have a Barrie, Ont address. This is an instance when activities that relieve poverty can be made available to recipients who are not experiencing poverty because doing so adds to the effectiveness of the food delivery program. People are more likely to use the program if they're not being asked to prove how poor they are.



Activities in Support of Purpose #1: Annual Christmas Food Drive

Part 1: Food Drive



To date, FFW has hosted two Christmas Food Drives: 1) <u>Dec. 21, 2020</u>, 2) <u>Dec. 23, 2021</u> <u>2020 Food drive news article</u> - Rock 95 The annual Christmas Food Drive is in support of single moms who've resided at the Women & Children's Shelter of Barrie at some point in time. Some produce for this food drive is donated by the pilot program's weekly donors, but the majority of the food is purchased in bulk at Costco (some items have to be purchased at Walmart as well). The money used to purchase this food is fundraised. All fundraising activities will be reported in the 'Gifts & Other Income Generating Activities' section.

On the food drive date, food is picked up and/or purchased and then taken to Connexus Community Church, located at 20 Mills Road, Barrie, ON, L4N 6H4, and then organized into individual orders by a group of volunteers. Then these volunteers personally deliver this food to the women who've signed up to receive it.

Part 2: Beauty Product Drive

For the 2021 Christmas Food Drive, FFW also did a beauty product drive; local beauty salons and individuals donated their unopened beauty products. Donations were picked up by FFW and stored at a Volunteer's home until Dec. 18, 2021, where items were then wrapped into 21 gift baskets (all 21 wicker baskets were donated as well) and delivered to the same single moms receiving the food on the weekend before the food delivery. I did this because I know they have little to no money and whatever money they do have will be spent on their children's Christmas gifts. This was a surprise for the recipients; many of whom said it would be the only gift they get for Christmas that year. I estimated we received \$2000-\$3000 worth of beauty products this year. This side of the annual Christmas activities is currently staffed by one volunteer; Leah Dyck.



Beneficiaries Selection Criteria

Beneficiaries of the annual Christmas food drive program are referred to FFW by the Women & Children's Shelter of Barrie. They are then selected on a first-come-first-serve basis.

Activities in Support of Purpose #1:

Inaugural event date: December 21, 2021

Fresh Food Weekly (FFW) partnered with Stone Horse Farm to deliver 'Christmas dinner foods' to 50 low-income families living in Barrie, On. Lisa Peterson is the owner of Stone Horse Farm, a pig farm FFW would drop off their extra food when it was no longer good for human consumption. She's also the manager of the Thornton Farmers' Market and runs Farm-to-Family - Local Fare Barrie. Lisa gathered a group of local farmers/food businesses to come together to create 50 meal boxes for low-income families that could be sold at a significantly reduced price; Cookstown Greens, Alliston Creamery, Integrated Farms, E.F.T Farms, East End Kitchen, R Family Farm and My Grandma's Farm.

Each meal box included one six-pound roasting chicken, 5 lbs of potatoes, 2 lbs carrots, one squash, one large head of broccoli, ready-made stuffing, cranberry sauce and a plate of baked desserts. Valued at \$73.50, they were sold for \$46 and could only be purchased so they could be given away. Here is an article published by Simcoe.com that includes some information on this activity.

FFW gathered a group of volunteers to meet at Thorganics, located at 7030 10th Line, Thornton, On. FFW received 50 pumpkin pies, four cheese wheels and organic hemp hearts which were added to the 50 meal boxes and then delivered to 50 low-income families who had signed up to receive them. Lisa has indicated she would like to do this again next year (2022).

Beneficiaries Selection Criteria

FFW informs recipients of the weekly food delivery program that they can sign up to receive this Christmas meal box to be delivered to their homes. Beneficiaries are selected on a first-come, first-serve basis.







Christmas Eve Hot Meal Delivery

FFW partnered with East Oro Berry Farm, located on 11th line, N, Oro-Medonte in December 2020 to deliver 20 hot turkey dinner plates (veggie sides and beverages included) to low-income individuals spending Christmas Eve alone and who resides in Barrie Public Housing. All the food was donated and prepared by Samantha Jarvis at East Oro Berry Farm. Samantha had intended to do this for Christmas 2021 but had to cancel at the last minute. She has indicated that she would like to do it again for Christmas 2022.

Beneficiaries Selection Criteria

Beneficiaries were selected by their address - anyone who lived in residential zoning for any type of subsidized housing complex.
